SECTION 4: First aid measures

4.1. Description of first aid measures

General information:

Remove victim out of the danger area. When in doubt or if symptoms are observed, get medical advice.

Following inhalation:

Remove casualty to fresh air and keep warm and at rest.

In case of skin contact:

Take off immediately all contaminated clothing. After contact with skin, wash immediately with plenty of water and soap. In case of skin irritation, consult a physician.

In case of contact with eyes flush immediately with plenty of flowing water for 10 to 15 minutes holding eyelids apart and consult an ophthalmologist.

If accidentally swallowed rinse the mouth with plenty of water (only if the person is conscious) and obtain immediate medical attention. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person or a person with cramps.

8.2.1. Appropriate engineering controls

If handled uncovered, arrangements with local exhaust ventilation have to be used. If local exhaust ventilation is not possible or not sufficient, the entire working area should be ventilated by technical
