SECTION 4: First aid measures

4.1. Description of first aid measures

General information:

Remove victim out of the danger area. When in doubt or if symptoms are observed, get medical advice.

Following inhalation:

Remove casualty to fresh air and keep warm and at rest. In case of respiratory tract irritation, consult a physician.

In case of skin contact:

Change contaminated, saturated clothing. After contact with skin, wash immediately with plenty of water and soap. In case of skin irritation, consult a physician.

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After eye contact:

Rinse immediately carefully and thoroughly with eye-bath or water. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Continue rinsing. In case of eye irritation consult an ophthalmologist.

Following ingestion:

Do NOT induce vomiting. Rinse mouth thoroughly with water. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person or a person with cramps. Where appropriate artificial ventilation. When in doubt or if symptoms are observed, get medical advice.
